Known to us as "Swervin' Mervin", we think his recognition is long overdue. Ever since the club has taken on the running of the Tees show, Merv has taken upon himself the responsibility of the construction and maintenance of all our trail equipment. In appreciation of all his years of hard work, in his honour, we are officially dedicating all our trail Classes as the *Mervin Hollihan Trail Class*.

We have also received confirmation that Horse, member of Team Mule, the 2008 Battle of the Breeds champions, will be in attendance. Horse and his owner, Deloit Wolfe, first showed at Tees in 1997, winning High Point Performance Mule. Together they rode, drove and log skidded. Both returned in 1998 and repeated their wins plus won the Versatility Award, which was a real revelation for everyone that INDEED mules can be WELL TRAINED. Deloit and Horse were part of Team Mule's very first competition at Spruce Meadows Battle of the Breeds in 1999 and every year since, until Deloit's passing in 2010. Horse still made it back to Spruce Meadows in 2010 with Deloit Jr. for the breed demonstrations.

The Alberta Donkey & Mule Club invites long-time participants and newcomers to come and enjoy a family oriented weekend while watching the skills of mules and donkeys performing in events more commonly associated with horses. From riding to driving to fun classes, you are guaranteed to have some laughs and become a Longears fan too.

Show Regulations

COMPETITOR CLASSIFICATIONS

JUNIOR: 14 years of age and under.

SENIOR: 15 years of age and over.

REGULATIONS

1. ALL EXHIBITORS must be members of the Alberta Equestrian Federation (AEF) or have equivalent insurance coverage. AEF membership numbers must be indicated on each entry form!
2. The Judge's decision is final.
3. The Show Committee reserves the right to alter, combine, split or cancel classes or entries without prior notice.
4. All youth exhibitors under the age of 18 MUST wear a helmet when mounted.
5. In classes in which animals can be ridden or led, it is acceptable to use a combination of both in the class.
6. Animals may be shown by different handlers in different classes.
7. Each exhibitor will be issued a number, which must be visible in each class. Numbers can be picked up at the show office on Friday evening between 6pm and 8pm or Saturday morning beginning at 8 am.
8. There will be no charge for show numbers; however you will be billed if yours is not returned! Please remember to return your number to the show office at the end of the show. THANK YOU!
9. Intact donkeys will be allowed to compete in regular classes. Jacks over the age of two years MUST wear an appropriate stallion bridle or chain halter, and BE UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES. Jacks must be kept separate from Jennies if in the same class. Any unruly animal may be excused from the class. No jack will be allowed to compete in any PEEWEE or YOUTH classes.
10. Ungelded mules over 1 year of age will not be allowed to participate nor will they be allowed on the show grounds.
11. Unruly animals will be excused from the premises. Animals and/or riders posing a danger to themselves or others will be asked to leave the arena by the Judge or Show Committee.
12. Cleaning up after your animals is expected.
13. Animal abuse will not be tolerated.
14. Tees Longears Days, the Tees Agricultural Society, and the Alberta Donkey and Mule Club will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, donkeys, mules or property at this show. It is to be understood and agreed that by making any entry, the competitor acknowledges that equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and they can hereby be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, donkeys, mules or property at this show. It is understood that a signed waiver will be required prior to receiving a participant number.

Class Descriptions

SHOWMANSHIP. Judged strictly on the exhibitor's ability to fit and show a donkey/mule at halter. A good performance consists of a poised, confident and neatly dressed handler and a well-groomed animal that performs the requested pattern with smoothness and precision. The conformation of the animal is NOT

judged.

1. Junior Showmanship (Donkey or Mule, any size)
2. Senior Showmanship (Donkey or Mule, any size)

TRAIL. This class has a set pattern to follow that is posted prior to the class. The mule or donkey is judged on his performance over or through the obstacles, his response to the rider or handler, and his manner of travel. Points are given for each obstacle navigated in a mannerly, safe and correct sequence. After 3 refusals at the same obstacle, the Judge will ask the rider or handler to proceed to the next obstacle. Animals in Lead line Trail are generally too small or too young to ride but are judged similarly.

3. **Mervin Hollihan** Open In-hand Trail
4. **Mervin Hollihan** Open Mule Trail, ridden
5. **Mervin Hollihan** Open Donkey Trail, ridden
6. **Mervin Hollihan** Junior Trail, ridden (Donkey or Mule)

PLEASURE DRIVING. Contestants will be judged both ways of the arena and may be asked to back up. The Judge will award those animals that are most obedient and look like a pleasure to drive.

7. Pleasure Driving, single (Mule)
8. Pleasure Driving, single (Donkey)
9. Pleasure Driving, single (Miniature)
11. Pleasure Driving, team (Mule)
12. Pleasure Driving, team (Donkey)
13. Pleasure Driving, team (Miniature)

COON JUMPING. Animal must jump from a standstill within a marked box. Two attempts allowed at each height in a reasonable amount of time. Handler must have lead rope in hand at all times, can direct from either side of the jump.

14. Open Coon Jumping

COWBOY POLO. Ridden. Just for fun, but can get a little rough as not much for rules!! Two teams are picked and object is to score goals with a ball. Referee rules and can be bought!!

15. Open Cowboy Polo (Saturday)
51. Open Cowboy Polo (Sunday)

TEAM DRIVING PATTERN:

Enter ring at a working trot on the left hand rail to # 1 (loading dock)

Back your team into dock

Do a full 90 degree swing to the left, pause, straighten out.

90 degree swing to the right, pause and straighten out.

Proceed at a working trot to # 2, do a figure 8.

At a working trot proceed to # 3

Halt with back wheel hubs level with the cones

Back up until front wheel hubs are level with the cones, pause, proceed to #4 at a working trot

Spin the cone with the off-side wheel as close to the cone as possible.

Leave the ring.

17. Driving Pattern, Team (Mule)
18. Driving Pattern, Team (Donkey)

SOCK HOP RACE. You will need a big sock and your donkey or mule. Bring your critter in hand or under saddle and get in the gate – the challenge is a race to put some fancy foot-warmers on their hooves! More instruction will be given by the announcer at the start of this crowd-pleaser.

20. Open Sock Hop Race

GUMMY WORM RACE. Timed. The contestant runs or rides down to the end of the arena and gets a "worm" out of a plate of whipped cream. Must use teeth or lips. NO HANDS. Races back across finish line and must show "worm" to the judge. Once time starts, you cannot touch your face. If your "worm" doesn't

make it across the finish line, you will be disqualified.

21. Open Gummy Worm Race

DRIVING PATTERN, SINGLE- Pattern will be posted at the show.

22. Driving Pattern, Single (Mule)

COSTUME CLASS. Anyone who comes to Tees Longears Days quickly discovers that Halloween comes *twice* each year! Anything goes; bring along your imagination and get dressed up with your donkey or mule!

25. Open Costume Class

FREESTYLE RIDING TO MUSIC. Riders to use their own riding pattern to music, Use your imagination for choreography and costume! Suggested elements: circles, lead changes, stops, spin each way, back up and speed control. Time limit of 2 – 2 1/2 minutes. Participants must get their music to the office by

Saturday morning!

33. Freestyle Riding to Music

POLE BENDING. Ridden. Pattern with 6 poles, 21' apart, set in a line. Can start from either side. Run to end of last pole, weave through and back, and run to finish line. Rider may touch pole but a pole knocked over is a 5 sec. penalty. Breaking pattern or going over the line is disqualification.

27. Junior Pole Bending (Mule)

28. Senior Pole Bending (Mule)

29. Junior or Senior Pole Bending (Donkey)

WALKING RACE. Contestants will ride from a designated spot to the finish line, keeping their animals at a walk. If you break stride, you may evade elimination by immediately turning your animal completely around and continuing the race. Separate classes for riding or driving animals may occur depending on number of entries.

30. Walking Race, (Miniature, Donkey or Mule)

31. Walking Race, (Donkey)

32. Walking Race, (Mule)

LOG PULLING. The object is to pull the log through the pattern in the shortest time possible. The boundary line is 30 feet long with the width between the pylons 15' for large animals and 12' for smaller animals. Penalty points will be given for knocked over or moved pylons or animals stepping out of boundary lines. Penalty points will be given for teamster who does not step over the log while turning or for riding on the log. The winner will be the entry with the least penalties and the fastest time. **OPTIONAL:** After negotiating the pattern, skidders will be asked to do a one-foot pull, a two-foot pull and a three-foot pull. A 4" allowance will be allowed at each stop. 5 penalty points for each missed stop.

HALTER. Donkeys or mules showing in the Halter classes shall be shown in hand in a halter. Silver shall not count over a plain stable halter. Animals shall be judged on correct conformation with the emphasis being on form to function. The judge may not discriminate for or against muscling, but rather look for a total picture, emphasising balance and structural correctness.

PLEASURE RIDING. Western or English, donkey or mule. Animals will be ridden at the walk, jog/trot and lope/ canter both directions of the ring. Judged on the pleasure of the ride and obedience of the animal.

- 46. Junior Western or English Pleasure (Donkey or Mule)
- 47. Senior Western or English Pleasure Mule
- 48. Senior Western or English Pleasure Donkey

SIMON SAYS. Ridden. Transitions or commands are to be executed ONLY if they are preceded by the phrase "Simon Says". Contestants are eliminated for errors. Last one out, wins.

- 50. Open Simon Says

LEAD LINE. Young riders are judged on their smiles, skills, riding ability and how much fun they can have in the saddle while being led on their long eared friend!

- 52. Lead Line Walk-Trot (Donkey or Mule)

EQUITATION. Riders are judged on their own skills and riding ability. Be prepared to do a pattern as requested.

- 53. Junior Western or English Equitation (Donkey or Mule)
- 54. Senior Western or English Equitation (Donkey or Mule)

BARREL RACE. Cloverleaf pattern consisting of three barrels. Rider may start at the right or left barrel and proceed to the opposite barrel, turn to the last barrel, and race back to the start/finish. Fastest time wins.

- 56. Junior Donkey 3 Barrel Race, ride or drive
- 57. Senior Donkey 3 Barrel Race, ride or drive
- 58. Junior Mule 3 Barrel Race, ride or drive
- 59. Senior Mule 3 Barrel Race, ride or drive

CANADIAN MAZE – driven. The maze is run over a pattern that looks like a cross (+). The course is a "cross" of cones set 15 feet apart in all directions. The object of the event is to enter and exit each arm of the cross once. [Or, the object is to travel each arm of the cross twice – once going toward the center of the cross, once exiting the cross.] The event is timed. The contestant who fails to enter and exit each leg of the cross once - or who enters or exits any leg of the cross more than once – is disqualified. There is a 10-second penalty for each cone disturbed. Contestant must enter the maze via the designated starting point and complete the maze by exiting through the designated finish point.

OPEN TEDDY BEAR RESCUE RACE. Manoeuvre the obstacles to locate the stranded teddy bear and return to the starting line.

WATER GLASS RACE, Ridden, Glasses of water are provided to each contestant. Rider with the most water left in glass after following the Judge's commands wins.

- 68. Open Water Glass Race

FLAPJACK RACE. Ridden or led. Contestant must build a fire and cook a pancake. Kindling and pancake batter is provided. Contestant must bring own pan, flipper and matches. Animal must remain with handler. First one back to finish line with edible pancake wins.

- 69. Open Flapjack Race

OLD CLOTHES RACE. Timed. Mounted at the starting line, contestants ride down to the opposite end to a bag containing old clothes. Dismount and while maintaining control of your animal, put on all the clothes

in the bag. Clothes are to be put on appropriately. If an item of clothing is lost on the way back, the rider must stop, pick it up and put it on again. Contestants are asked to please bring suitable items of clothing from home to "add" to the "pot"!
